Important Information and Registration Details

Weekly Summer camps run Monday-Thursday and cost \$400 for the week and are open to ages 6-12.

Each camper will receive a camp shirt and may take home any crafts they make during the week.

A \$200 non-refundable deposit is required with registration, with the final balance due 2 weeks BEFORE camp begins. You will not receive a bill for the balance due. Payments not received before the start of camp may result in your child's spot being given to another child.

Camps have a limited enrollment and are filled on a first come first served basis, so don't wait to sign up.

More Info

Campers should wear long pants and riding boots with a heel. Helmets will NOT be provided. Your child may wear a properly fitted bike helmet or bring his/her own riding helmet. We will have some new helmets at the farm available for purchase.

Bring a sack lunch and water bottle. Weather permitting, campers will get to go swimming, so bring a swimsuit, towel, and sunscreen as well.



Typical Camp Day

Camp Hours: 10:00am - 3:00pm

Campers will bring in the horses together and then be divided into two groups. Group A will groom and tack the horses while group B will learn other horse related activities. Group A will ride, and when done they will switch with group B who will ride next. When riding is complete, group B will untack the horses. During group B's ride time, group A will learn horse related activities. There will be a lunch break, and weather permitting campers will swim in the owner's pool. The afternoon session will start with group B tacking up the horses to ride, and group A starting with their alternate activities or crafts before their second riding session. Campers will demonstrate their new skills in a small show during the afternoon of the final day of camp.
